

Notes For The Journey

What do you mean when you say "I am a Christian?" How do you share that with others? Here is a lovely poem that gives expression to one person's understanding of what being a Christian means:

When I say... "I am a Christian"

(Unknown Author)

When I say... "I am a Christian." I'm not shouting "I'm clean living'."

I'm whispering "I was lost, now I'm found and forgiven."

When I say... "I am a Christian." I don't speak of this with pride.

I'm confessing that I stumble, and need Christ to be my guide.

When I say... "I am a Christian." I'm not trying to be strong.

I'm professing that I'm weak, and need His strength to carry on.

When I say... "I am a Christian." I'm not bragging of success.

I'm admitting I have failed, and need God to clean my mess.

When I say... "I am a Christian." I'm not claiming to be perfect.

My flaws are far too visible, but God believes I am worth it.

When I say... "I am a Christian." I still feel the sting of pain.

I have my share of heartaches, so I call upon His name.

When I say... "I am a Christian." I'm not holier than thou.

I'm just a simple sinner who received God's good grace, somehow! The scriptures encourage us to take inventory regularly to search ourselves, to evaluate who we are; to answer for ourselves the question that Jesus asks us about who we say He is; and to define for ourselves what we really mean when we say that we are Christians. Indeed, self-examination is a Biblical mandate as well as a necessary pathway to spiritual growth. It is also a necessary ingredient for sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with others.

The poem above speaks of the writer's personal definition of being Christian. The poem not only reveals something of the author's self-understanding in relationship to God, but also gives expression to the poet's experience and reliance upon the Good News of Jesus Christ. When this poet says "I am a Christian" he/she is saying:

"I have personally experienced the Good News of Jesus Christ. I have experienced the Good News as forgiveness, guidance, strength, assurance, renewal, comfort and grace; and I trust and rely upon this Good News for my wellbeing. That is what has gotten me through all the difficult and messed-up parts of my life"

Most folks haven't got a clue about what you really mean when you say "I am a Christian." Indeed, many of us are reluctant to talk about it with others because we're afraid of being misunderstood. However, there is not one single person on the planet who doesn't understand and hasn't suffered from being lost, from stumbling, weakness, failure, flaws, pain, loss and sin. Moreover, there is no one who is not – at the very least – curious about the possibility of Good News for them. And there is no one on earth who isn't at least *hoping* that there really is a source forgiveness, guidance, strength, assurance, renewal, comfort and grace powerful enough to move them forward and through all the difficult and messed-up parts of their lives.

I invite and encourage you to name and to write down your personal experiences of the Good News of Jesus Christ – not what you profess to believe – but what you have actually experienced. And don't stop there! I invite and encourage you to also seek opportunities for sharing something of your experience of forgiveness, guidance, strength, assurance, renewal, comfort, or grace with others who need to know that the Good News is happening, is real, and they can experience it too.


Helping Hands Ministry
